


Smisby Allotment News

Parish Council NEWS Items from the January Parish

Council Meeting

New Parish Councillor

It was unanimously agreed at the Parish Council meeting in November 2014 that Rob Hounslow should be co-opted on to the Parish Council. The Parish Council would like to welcome Rob onto the Parish Council and are looking forward to working with him.

Fly Tipping

Unfortunately there have been a few incidences of fly tipping around Smisby, most notably in Annwell Lane. The Councils Cléan Team try to ensure the swift removal of fly-tipped waste to prevent it being added to. Smisby Parish Council have been given the following advice about fly tipping by South Derbyshire District Council: Never accept an offer from someone you don't know to dispose of waste for payment. If you are approached then pass details onto the Councils Safer Neighbourhood Wardens who can investigate if they are a registered waste carrier. To carry out a search they need to know the name of the business or individual who approached you and the registration number of their vehicle. The Safer Neighbourhood Wardens can be contacted on 01283 595795. You can report incidents of Fly Tipping to the Clean Team on 0800 5872349.

Police Information

There has been an attempted theft of outdoor/garden equipment in the Smisby area. Please ensure that any equipment, including sit on mowers are locked securely away. The Police are aware of the long standing issue in regards to reporting crime to Derbyshire Police due to Smisby being so close to the Leicestershire boarder. Discussions are taking place within the call handling department in order to try and get this resolved. The Parish Council have also have been asked by the local PCSO Karen Coldicott, to advise that the contact numbers for the police are 101 for non-emergency calls and 999 for emergency calls.

The next Safer Neighbourhood meeting is on Tuesday 3rd February at 6.15pm, in Findern Village Hall. All members of the public are invited to attend to discuss any community issues that police need to be aware of.

Safer Homes Initiative

South Derbyshire CVS are offering a free service working to improve security in the homes of older (aged 60+) and vulnerable people who live in South Derbyshire. The scheme works by installing security equipment free of charge, including door chains, window alarms and spy holes. In addition, the Safer Homes operative will give free crime prevention advice. Smisby Village Hall

The last few months have been a busy period for the village hall committee. Since the change in membership the committee has been working hard to ensure that the Village Hall continues to offer a first class venue for all of the users and parishioners.



The priorities of the committee have been focussed on: Reviewing the current trust deed to ensure that it reflects modern requirements. We are currently seeking independent advice as to how it should be updated and the committee will propose a resolution for changes to the trust deed at the next AGM which is planned to take place in April 2015. All residents and parishioners are welcome to attend the AGM, so please watch Village notice boards for confirmation of the date and time.

Evaluating the current use of the hall and reviewing the standard hire terms as well as all of the health and safety requirements that go with the hiring of a facility such as this. The standard terms of hire have now been updated and will form the basis of all hiring from January 2015 onwards. A new risk assessment has also been completed which will be available to all users. Assessing what maintenance work needs to be completed and what additional equipment / facilities should to be added to ensure the hall remains a top class facility for all users. We have a number of ideas, but suggestions would be most welcome. Reviewing the Village Hall website. A new site (linked to the village website) is being designed and it is hoped this will be live in the near future. The site will include information on when the hall is in use by regular hirers, hire rates and important documents (Booking Form, Terms & Conditions, Health & Safety Policy, Risk Assessment, etc). More details will follow when available.

We are grateful to all users of the Village Hall for their continued support and are particularly pleased that Smisby Day Nursery will continue as a key user of the hall.

The Village Hall remains available to regular and 'one-off" hirers and following the review of standard terms and individual users requirements, the hall is now also available for hire during school term time between 9:00am and 3:00pm. Hire rates for non-parishioners have increased slightly from 1st January 2015. but hire charges for Smisby Parish Members remain unchanged.

Booking enquiries can be made with the Bookings Clerk on the new number 07526 268698.

Smisby Parish Member rates are as follows:

1 hour: £12; Up to 2.5 hours: £15.00; 1/2 Day (4 hours): £29.00; Full Day (8 hours): £44.50

Hire times and charges include the setting up and clearing away period. Different charges apply to hirers from outside the local community. Deposits will be required separately, which are refundable following a satisfactory post event inspection. There may be certain occasions when one-off events can take precedence over long-term regular bookings, but normally this will require not less than one month's notice. Continued above

We are now delighted to report that two village residents have volunteered to be this sub-committee, namely Rachel Hewitt (Truro Cottage, Chapel Street) and Dawn Barnett (Maycliffe, Chapel The aim of the sub-committee will be to provide a conduit between people in the parish and the Parochial Charity, for project ideas that might be funded by the charity. Any ideas put forward will be reviewed in detail for financial viability and merit with respect to improvement for the community at large. If anyone has suggestions or ideas, then please don't hesitate to discuss with either Rachel or Dawn, or to send them a note or letter - and of course you can always have a word with any of the Trustees or with Sheila, Clerk to the Trustees.
